# RE: HEARING STATEMENT ON PLAN CHANGE 14 (INTENSIFICATION) TO THE CHRISTCHUCH DISTRICT PLAN

# 1. INTRODUCTION

1.1 This Hearing Statement has been prepared on behalf of bp Oil New Zealand Limited, Mobil Oil New Zealand Limited, and Z Energy Limited (the Fuel Companies) and represents their views. It is not expert evidence. As advised in the email to Jo Daly, Director of the Secretariat for the Independent Hearings Panel, from Jarrod Dixon dated 15<sup>th</sup> November (Attachment 1), the Fuel Companies (submitter 372) will not be attending the hearing but ask that this Hearing Statement be tabled before the Panel.

# 2. THE FUEL COMPANIES SUBMISSION AND POSITION

- 2.1 The Fuel Companies made submissions on several chapters proposed to be amended by Plan Change 14 (*PC14*) to the Christchurch District Plan (*PDP*). The Fuel Companies' submission points and position on Council's Section 42A (s42a) recommendations are set out in the following paragraphs.
- 2.2 **Chapter 5 Natural Hazards:** The Fuel Companies sought clarity that phrase 'intensification of any site' in Clause (a) of Policy 5.2.2.5.1 only relates to higher density residential activities (i.e. not new developments associated with non-residential activities) and that Clause (b) applies to all buildings rather than just those associated with residential activities or residential intensification. The s42a recommendation is to accept the Fuel Companies by amending the wording to 'residential intensification' in all objectives, policies and rules. The Fuel Companies support this approach.
- 2.3 **Chapter 6 General Rules (Sub-chapter 6.5 Scheduled Activities):** The Fuel Companies sought these provisions be retained as notified, noting that only minor changes were proposed to reflect the updated naming of the residential zones. The Fuel Companies support the s42a recommendation to retain these provisions as notified.
- 2.4 **Chapter 8 Subdivision, Development and Earthworks**: The Fuel Companies sought clarification that Rule 8.9A (Development and Activities in Wastewater Constraint Areas) or, specifically, the 'expansion of activities' in this overlay (where several service stations are located) only captures activities which involve increasing the volume of wastewater rather than general maintenance or upgrades to existing activities. The requested clarity was provided in the s42a recommendation that the rule only captures activities that increase the volume of wastewater. This is supported by the Fuel Companies.

- 2.5 **Chapter 14 Residential:** The Fuel Companies sought various changes to the proposed/amended policies, residential design principles and matters of discretion for residential activities in the residential chapter to provide direction for the management of reverse sensitivity effects on existing lawfully established non-residential activities. The S42a recommendation was to accept the requested inclusion in the relevant policies and matters of discretion but not the residential design principles. The Fuel Companies accept and support the reasoning provided in the s42a recommendation.
- 2.6 The Fuel Companies also sought amendments to proposed Objective 14.2.12 and Policy 14.2.12.1 to acknowledge that reverse sensitivity effects can occur between residential activities and lawfully established industrial activities on non-industrial zone sites in addition to those in industrial zones. The s42a recommendation was to reject the Fuel Companies submission point on the basis this objective and policy only applies to residential activities located in the Industrial Interface Qualifying Matter. The Fuel Companies accept the reasoning and amended wording in the s42a recommendation.
