Chapter 2 Abbreviations and Definitions

Residential activity

means the use of land and/or buildings for the purpose of living accommodation. It includes:

- (a) a residential unit, boarding house, student hostel or a family flat (including accessory buildings);
- (b) emergency and refuge accommodation;
- (c) use of a residential unit as a holiday home where a payment in money, goods or services is not exchanged;
- (d) house-sitting and direct home exchanges where a tariff is not charged;
- (e) rented accommodation and serviced apartments not covered by clause (g) and where individual bookings are for a minimum of 28 consecutive days (except in the Specific Purpose (Golf Resort Zone) and
- (f) sheltered housing;

excludes:

(g) visitor accommodation including hotels, resorts, motels, motor and tourist lodges, backpackers, hostels, farm stays, camping grounds, hosted visitor accommodation in a residential unit and unhosted visitor accommodation;

(h) the use of land and/or buildings for custodial and/or supervised living accommodation where residents are detained on the site.

Sheltered housing

means a residential unit or units used solely for the accommodation of persons for whom on-site professional emergency care, assistance or response is available, but not where residents are detained on the site.

Residential activity

means the use of land and/or buildings for the purpose of living accommodation. It includes:

- (a) a residential unit, boarding house, student hostel or a family flat (including accessory buildings);
- (b) emergency and refuge accommodation;
- (c) use of a residential unit as a holiday home where a payment in money, goods or services is not exchanged;
- (d) house-sitting and direct home exchanges where a tariff is not charged;

excludes:

(h) the use of land and/or buildings for <u>a corrections prison as defined</u>
<u>in the Corrections Act 2004</u>custodial and/or supervised living
accommodation where residents are detained on the site.

Sheltered housing

means a residential unit or units used solely for the accommodation of persons for whom on-site professional emergency care, assistance or response is available, but <u>excludes a corrections prison as defined in the Corrections Act 2004-not where residents are detained on the site</u>.
